NEW 96 BED UHL UNIT LEFT IN LIMBO

MINISTER for Health Simon Harris was unable to confirm if University Hospital Limerick will have its crucial, extra 96 beds included in the Government's 10-year capital plan. For more than a year, the UL Hos-

pitals Group has sought funds from the Government to deliver the proposed acute bed block in order to alleviate UHL's chronic overcrowding crisis.

There were 62 patients treated on emergency department trolleys and on extra trolleys or beds in the wards at UHL on Monday - the worst in the country, daily figures show.

 $UHL\ had\ 1,\!003\ patients\ on\ trolleys$ in January, which was the highest trolley rate in the country during the "worst ever" month for overcrowding, the INMO said.

So far, approximately €1m has been set aside for the first stage.

But just days before the announcement of masterplan for the next decade, the Minister remained tightlipped about whether it will be good news day for UHL this Friday.

before Speaking the launch of the Barrack View primary healthcare centre this Monday afternoon, Minister Harris said: "You will understand that I will be in awful big trouble if I start reading out what is or isn't in the plan. But let me say this, I know the people of the Mid-West and the people of Limerick have been promised additional hospital beds for many, many years. In fact, they were promised that when various reconfigurations were put in place that the beds would come.

reconfiguration went ahead, the beds never came. I think that it's absolutely vital that we show good faith here and that we deliver the beds. I still do not understand how Governments of the past decided to reduce bed capacity in this region. I am determined to increase it. The 96-bed project is a really important development for Limerick, and I am very hopeful that we will be able to deliver good news in relation to that," he said.

The Minister told reporters that even if the 96 beds were sanctioned, "it would take some time to put them in place. That's why I have asked the HSE to look at what interim measures we could do, because I think there are interim measures that we could do."

Minister Harris said the new emergency department, which he launched in June last, has "definitely improved the working environment for staff in Limerick and also the environment for patients. It has provided single rooms and isolation facilities that, quite frankly, weren't there when I visited the old ED in Limerick. So I am delighted that we were able to invest in this, but there is clearly a need for more beds in the Mid-West region".

New care centre 'another milestone' for Mid-West

THE MINISTER for Health Simon Harris has said that the new state-of-the-art healthcare centre in the city centre will improve locals' access to "better care, close to home".

This Monday afternoon, Minister Harris welcomed the opening of the Barrack View primary healthcare centre on Lord Edward Street, following a multimillion investment from the international banking sector.

The new two-storey complex will officially open its doors next Monday, serving more than 10,000 people in the city.

Barrack View is one of 14 new complexes nationwide, with €70m being provided by the European Investment Bank, Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi, and Talanx Asset Management.

Speaking at the launch this week, Minister Harris said that it was a "pleasure" to open the new facility.

"Primary care is at the heart of what we do in the Health Service. Facilities, like this one here in Limerick, ensure that we can deliver more health care in the community, so that people can access better care, close to home. This shift towards primary care will help keep

people well and minimise the number of patients being admitted to our hospitals.

"This Government has invested significantly in recent times in our primary care infrastructure and we now have 110 modern, well equipped primary care

centres. These centres allow our primary care teams and GPs to be located together, which means the delivery of a wider range of integrated primary care services," he stated.

HSE services provided at the new centre include public health nursing,

speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, podiatry, psychology services, and dietetic services. Dr Gerard O'Brien will also be stationed at the clinic as resident GP.

HSE Mid-West's chief officer, Bernard Gloster said

that Monday marked "another milestone" for the region's healthcare infrastructure.

"Primary care is the bedrock of the reform of the Irish health service, and we are very pleased to have arrived at this juncture today."

Lollipop Day aims to fight cancer

THE ANNUAL Lollipop Day collection for oesophageal cancer is set to take place in Limerick on the weekend of February 23 and 24 to raise vital research funding for the disease.

Limerick Metropolitan Mayor Sean Lynch will also host a coffee morning on Tuesday, February 20 between 10 and 12 at City Hall, to raise funds for the vital cause.

Ireland has one of the highest rates of oesophageal cancer in Europe, with almost 400 new cases diagnosed every year - a number which is estimated to rise to at least 800 by 2040, according to the National Cancer Registry Ireland.

"I know that times are still tough for a lot of people, but I would ask them to support Lollipop Day because we receive no state funding and are totally reliant on our fundraising income," said Lim-Lollipop

fundraising organiser Noel

The people of Limerick were very generous in last year's Lollipop Day collection, raising €21,000 for oesophageal cancer research, and raising public awareness of the disease.

When Noel contracted oesophageal cancer 14 years ago, he had never heard of the disease.

"This is one of the lesser known cancers in Ireland and I had to get the surgeon to explain to me that it was cancer of the gullet," he said.

Noel survived the tough treatment. "I was very grateful and I wanted to give something back to the Irish Oesophageal Cancer Fund (OCF) - the organisation that raises awareness of the symptoms of this cancer and provides funding for research," he said.

Experts and survivor to give insights into breast cancer at free **UHL** public lecture

THE PUBLIC will this week get an insight into University Hospital Limerick's symptomatic breast unit and the services available to those with breast cancer in the Mid-West region.

The free public lecture will take place at the Clinical Education and Research Centre at the Dooradoyle hospital this Tuesday at 6pm.

As part of UL Hospitals' lecture series and Healthy Ireland programme, a number of medical experts will speak at the event.

The line-up includes breast cancer survivor Ciara consultant McNamara: breast surgeon, Ashish Lal; senior specialist breast radiographer Kim Wheeler; and Meadbh MacSweeney, clinical lymphoedema nurse specialist. Speaking ahead of the event, Mr Lal said that they will detail lymphoedema, one of the more common post-operative complications of breast cancer.

"This is actually a poorly understood phenomenon

and our lymphoedema specialist will go through it, explain what exactly it is and what patients can do about it to counter any misconception that if you do get it, it is the end of the world and nothing can be done.

"We want to tell the public what we do in the Symptomatic Breast Unit and what the journey is like for them once they are referred here. Some of the specialist team will talk people through some of the more common things we do here," Mr Lal said.

The service is centred in the Symptomatic Breast Unit, which opened on the Fourth Floor of the Leben Building at UHL in 2016. The unit includes two ultrasound and two mammography suites with cutting edge diagnostics; consultation rooms; a multidisciplinary team conference room; a prosthesis fitting room; a family room; administrative offices and a quiet room where women can retire for cancer consultations and information.

COURIER: DEFENDANT WAS TRANSPORTING DRUGS FROM CITY

Cannabis found in spare tyre of van

A JUDGE has warned a man who was caught transporting almost €60,000 worth of cannabis that he is keeping all of his options

Patrick Foley, aged 29, who has an address at Brookville Avenue, Tipperary Town, has pleaded guilty to possession of around 3kgs of the drugs for the pur-pose of sale or supply at Ballysimon Road January 6, 2016.

The drugs were recovered when a vehicle was stopped and searched around two miles side the city.

Detective Garda Martin McCarthy told Limerick Circuit Court there was a "notable smell" emanating from the boot of the van which travelling bound when stopped. The cannabis was found concealed inside a spare tyre



Judge Tom O'Donnell adjourned the matter for twelve months

which had been slit.

While Foley was not the registered owner of the vehicle, he admitted travelling by bus to Limerick earlier in the day to collect the van knowing there were

drugs hidden inside.

Tom McGowan BL said his client cooperated with gardai and made "full and frank admissions" following

He said the father-of-two,

who has no great wealth, had developed a severe drug addiction following the death of his father and that his life was spiraling out of control.

"Everything was going swimmingly well. It (his father's death) had an absolutely catastrophic effect on him and he turned to drink and drugs," he said.

He submitted Foley was a "pawn in this operation" and that he would have been under pressure to drive the van from others higher up the chain.

During a review of the case, Judge Tom O'Donnell noted Mr Foley has been doing very well since he completed a residential treatment programme last summer.

Noting the defendant's difficult personal circumhe said he was willing to give him a chance by adjourning the matter for review in twelve months'

"I'll give credit where credit is due but I'm keeping all of my options open," he

Jailed for role in robbery at city internet cafe

YOUNG man who threatened and robbed a worker at an internet cafe in the city centre has been jailed for three years, writes David Hurley.

James Connors, aged 24, of Lord Edward Street had pleaded guilty to charges relating to an incident at Station Internet Cafe, Davis Street, on February 20,

The defendant, who was heavily intoxicated, was one of two men who entered the premises at around 7.25pm.

One of the men threatened a worker while the second went behind the counter and took a significant quantity of cash from the register.

Limerick Circuit Court was told a struggle then ensued during which the employee produced an umbrella and confronted the culprits who escaped with around €1,200 in cash.

Garda Eoghan Donagh said having been alerted to the cident, gardai located the culprits nearby a short time later. However, he said the stolen money was not recovered and compensation has not been paid.

Brian McInerney BL,

representing Mr Connors, said his client cooperated with gardai and made comprehensive admissions regarding his role in the offence following his arrest.

He commented that CCTV from the internet cafe was of outstanding quality and showed the "utter incompetence" of his client.

He said Mr Connors was "not compos mentis" on the night as he was heavily intoxicated when he entered the premises.

"Short of going in with a sandwich board and a flashing neon light, he couldn't have advertised his intentions any better," he

During a sentencing hearing, Garda McDonagh agreed with the barrister that while in the premises the second culprit, who has not been prosecuted, appears, according to the CCTV footage, to be intent on "escalating" the incident while Mr Connors can be seen trying to calm him down.

Imposing sentence, Judge Tom O'Donnell said what happened was very serious and cannot be tolerated. He imposed a three year prison sentence, backdating it to the date of the offence.

nouncement from the Minster of Social Protection that more resources are to be allocated to address the significant delays in processing of carers allowance applica-

"New claims for Carers Allowance are currently taking approximately 17 weeks to process while the Domiciliary Care Allowance applications are taking 15 weeks to pro-

"There should be continuity in the amount of time a person has to wait for their social welfare application to be

"Other social welfare payments such as job seeker's benefit, illness benefit or a widow or widower's contributory pension are processed in one week," she stated this week.

CITY residents have expressed anger over Limerick City and County Council's decision to recently knock the Thomondgate weir wall.

That is according to Sinn Fein councillor John Costelloe who is now calling on the Council to provide more community consultation prior to these types of decisions being made.

Cllr Costelloe, who held a community meeting last Tuesday to discuss the matter, said that he received "numerous calls from local residents angry to have been woken to the knocking of this wall".

"Concerns were expressed regarding how this decision could impact on them with fears of increased dumping and anti-social behaviour in the area," he said.

He commended two Council officials for attending the meeting at Kinsella's Bar, after which "many of these fears have since been allayed".

"While their attendance was

greatly appreciated, it is regretful that such a consultation wasn't held prior to the commencement of works on the weir.

"There remains a frustration in the area that such a location, straddling the river, remains in a condition of disrepair.

"At a time when we are trying to highlight our maiden city to tourists globally, it seems remiss of our Council to leave such an idyllic river bank location in such a condition.

"We hope now that the Council will commence consultation with residents in the area to determine how to utilize this location for the betterment of the local community and the city more generally," the north-side councillor said.



PURSUIT: STOLEN CAR WAS DRIVEN AT SPEEDS IN EXCESS OF 120KPH DURING CHASE IN CITY

Driver was high and banned

THE driver of a stolen car which flipped "at least three times" during a high speed pursuit was disqualfied from driving and did not have insurance, a court has heard.

Michael Shanahan, aged 25, of Garryglass Avenue, Ballinacurra Weston, has pleaded guilty to multiple charges relating to an incident in the early hours of May 19, 2017.

During a sentencing hearing, Detective Garda Brian Culbert said the defendant stole a 12L-registered Peugeot 308 from the driveway of a house at Ballinacurra Road after opening the front door of the

house and taking the keys.

Some time later – at around 2am – gardai were alerted to a collision involving the stolen car and another car at the junction of Childers Road and Hyde

Judge Tom O'Donnell was told the defendant had driven through a red light and that he failed to remain at the scene.

Gardai encountered the Peugeot at Lord Edward Street a short time later with its lights turned off.

'Quite a chase ensued," said John O'Sullivan BL, instructed by state solicitor Padráig Mawe.

Detective Garda Culbert said the stolen Peugeot reached speeds in excess of 120kph during the pursuit and that it drove the wrong way on Rosbrien Road.

The vehicle performed a

180 degree turn in the car park of Lidl before travelling to Greenfields Road in an attempt to evade gardai.

After entering Ballinacurra Gardens, the vehicle struck a footpath flipped a number of times before landing on its roof.

Pat Whyms BL said his client had attended a party earlier in the night during which he consumed cocaine and Xanax.

"He was in a bad state," he said noting that blood tests taken on the night had shown a high concentration of the drugs in Mr Shanahan's system.

Having been shown photographs of the crash scene, O'Donnell commented they were "enlightening and frightening".

The matter was adjourned to March 5, next for sentencing.

book looks at the healing and the things I did to help myself from alternative healing to tips and tricks I picked up over the years. I'll also be touching on organ donation as my dad was a kidney transplant recipient getting his transplant when he was 21

and only for that I wouldn't even be here.

I love that my publisher, Book Hub Publishing, is letting my be so heavily involved with the design of the book and I've been looking at colour schemes lately. I've finalised the front cover image as well and it is going to be a butterfly as they have been hugely significant to me.



Humanist and spiritual 'I dos' are capturing the imagination

More Limerick couples are marrying in unconventional ways

CELTIC priest Dara Molloy hardly has enough time to take a holiday, his services are in such high demand

"It's the one time of the year I don't have weddings, chuckled.

"And even this time of the year I do managed to find two weeks now where I'm free so I'm grabbing that!

As an secular solemniser specialising performing wedding blessings and marriage ceremonies in the Celtic tradition, his schedule is fully booked for Fridays and Saturdays this up-

More and more Limerick couples are opting to tie the knot in a different way, veering away from traditional church weddings and choosing instead to celebrate their love with humanist, spiritualist and Celtic ceremonies.

Secular wedding ceremonies in Limerick have increased by more than 160% in the last two years, according to figures from the Civil Registry Office.

While humanist ceremonies are free from any references to religion, elements of religion can be incorporated into a non-denominational spiritual ceremony although ceremonies don't conform to the same aspects of mainstream religious be-

"It's a secular ceremony in that while its a spiritual ceremony, it doesn't emanate from any particular religion or church but it is still very spiritual."

"In the ceremony itself you'd have the usual things! You'd have an aisle, and you'd have the bride walked in with maybe her bridal

party or maybe her dad."

'There's a lot of flexibility with my ceremonies. I give people an outline of the sort of things I can do and Igive them an outline of a possible structure, but I say to them - 'That's yours now, that's like a menu in a restaurant, you pick what you want out of that'. I'm very open, flexible and

people like that because they want to be able to design the wedding themselves.

> lot of people who deal with me, they want a blessing or prayers included. Not necessarily Catholic

prayers, may be a secular prayer. If they don't want God mentioned, I'll call in the four elements, or I'll say a gath-

ering prayer which means I gather up all the good wishes and blessings people have wished them on their wedding day to surround them with all that goodwill."

"Couples can also have any type of reading they like, scripture if they want but most people don't go for scripture, they can have poetry, they can have extracts from books, they can have even the words of songs. There's a lovely song by Leonard Cohen called Dance Me to the End of Love, lyrics like that."

He tends to get to know each couple quite well.

"I give them options for how I can dress for the ceremony because I can dress in my suit but I can also dress as a druid, or as a monk or as a priest and that really depends on what sort of tone they are setting with their ceremony. If there's a lot of Christian prayers in it I might dress as a priest, if they wanted to be more spiritual without anyone expression of one religion, then I might dress as a monk and if they want to go for the full on Celtic, then I'll dress as a druid.'

"The druid is very popular."

Last summer, in demand makeup artist Sarah Morris, from

Raheen, married Dave Dineen in a lakeside spiritualist ceremony that took place at sunset at their home which nestles on Lough Derg.

"But of course we got married in June, when it doesn't get dark until about 10.30pm," she laughed.

"A lot of my friends this year would have gone down that road. I genuinely just think that a lot of people my age don't go to Mass so it would be hypocritical doing the whole church thing. I can understand why you would, but I wouldn't feel right going into a church and getting married considering I never go to Mass or practice any religion, that would be my reasoning behind

"But Dave and I don't necessarily not believe in religion either. We felt like a spiritualist ceremony would be best because if you want to incorporate religion, you have that option. We didn't end up doing that in

"We just wanted to have our wed-

ding as personal as possible, so having the ceremony at home meant we weren't going to be able to get married in a church."

The couple found their celebrant, Aidan Storey through spirutalceremonies.ie.

After a family dinner in the nearby Killaoe village, Sarah and Dave joined their 126 guests for a drinks reception. Afterwards, they exchanged their vows in a "rustic' ceremony on the lake shore. Later, her guests had the option of camping through the night.

The bride also opted to wear white; "I had gold stars on my dress but I still wore white!"

Instead of a reading, Sarah's sister-in-law and brother carried out a mindfulness exercise.

"The idea was to take a few moments to get everybody present in the moment so it was almost like a mediation because I suppose the day runs so quickly and everybody is rushing, it grounded everybody and helped to appreciate the surround-

"And around the actual legal ceremony, we did the tying the knot, which is actually tying the knot. We had four different ribbons to represent earth, wind, fire and water, all different colours. The idea is that you get three different generations to tie the ribbons So myself and Dave, our hands were on top of each others, then my mother put one ribbon over us, my sister put another ribbon on and our niece put another one and they were all tied. Myself and Dave pulled our hands apart and Dave's niece caught the

"Dave's mum had passed away a few months before so we lit a remembrance candle to represent her and her presence, I don't know if that's done in traditional cere-

"I guess the only thing that was close to tradition ceremonies was the legal part because that has to be included in every ceremony."

Their family loved the ceremony, she said.

They were just happy to let me and Dave do our own thing.

"I have heard of people who go down the non-traditional route who get a lot of stick from their families but usually they love it anyway.

"They just might be afraid of the unknown I guess.'

"Because it's such an amazing day and it's all about love and bringing people together, you don't hear that feedback after it happens so that apprehension before is just a fear of the unknown."

WHEN it comes to choosing a diamond ring, it can seem like the possibilities are endless.

There's a host of considerations that need to be contemplated, like cut, colour, clarity and size.

But the whole experience needn't be overwhelming. The diamond experts at Matthew Stephens are on hand to offer their advice on everything you need to know about choosing that special diamond.

"We'd always advise customers to buy the best quality, it's something that they will have forever," said Matthew Ryan, of Matthew Stephens.

"You want something that is made to last and can stand the test of time into the future, which might be 30, 40 or 50 years of constant wear."

Many people don't realise that most of the world's diamonds are naturally tinted slightly yellow (these are categorised to be in the colour range: I-Z).

At the top of the colour scale, 'exceptionally white' diamonds (D-E) can also be viewed at Matthew Stephens when making that special decision to pop the question.

CLARITY

Most diamonds have obvious inclusions. These are black flecks or crack-like marks inside the diamond. The level of inclusion in a diamond is also measured on a scale, from I (included) to SI (slightly included) all the way up to perfect, flawless diamonds, which are extremely rare.





The changing face of Irish weddings

That's according to new research from gift card company One4all which delves into the psyche of wedding attendees in Ireland.

LOCATION, LOCATION, LOCATION

Before the 'I dos', bridal couples must decide where to celebrate their nuptials and according to the research carried out among 599 adults*, 37 per cent of those polled would travel anywhere for a loved one's wedding.

Some 61per cent reveal that they

would travel outside Ireland with 59 per cent agreeing that a wedding abroad would be fun.

However, 11 per cent say they wouldn't travel beyond their own county to make the wedding of a loved one.

For those who do decide to wed abroad, three in 10 guests believe the bridal couple shouldn't expect to receive a gift.

BE MY GUEST...

Attending a wedding can be an expensive experience and the One4all research shows that wedding guests in Ireland spend an average of €186 on a present for the bridal couple.

Other average expenses on the big day for guests include; €163 on a new outfit and accessories, €87 on drinks at the reception and €207 on accommodation.

But what do guests expect when they're invited to a wedding?

Food! A sit down meal is the item guests at a wedding most expect the bridal couple to provide, so say a total of 88 per cent of those polled.

Not just that, but 57 per cent surveyed expect second helpings to be served again later in the evening while just three per cent of adults in Ireland think a free bar should be provided at a traditional wedding reception.







Choose well to tie outfit together

ou've picked the suit, the shirt, the shoes, and even the belt... and now the hard part...

Far from one-size-fits-all, the wrong tie (in the wrong place, at the wrong time) can be just as bad for your look as any ill-fitting suit. So it pays to know your stuff.

For instance, did you know that your body type dictates the ideal width of your neckwear? Or that not all textures will fly in the office?

Or that the wrong pattern can make you look like a clown from The Apprentice? No? Well, read on and find out exactly how you should be wearing a tie and why doing so the right way is the easiest way to up your style game.

WIDTH AND LENGTH

Every well-dressed gent knows that one of the secrets of a good outfit is proportion. But while most know to pick a suit that matches their frame, it's a rule that's often forgotten when it comes to ties.

Different tie widths suit different body shapes. The correct tie should complement your suit and keep your outfit in proportion.

This can be achieved by matching the width of your tie to the width of your lapels (slim for slim, wide for wide), which will already have been matched to your frame.

A broad man should consider a slightly wider tie [around three inches] to match his larger shoulders.

Slim ties usually around two inches] suit skinnier guys because it complements their [narrow] body type just make sure your shirt collar is smaller in proportion, too.

As for the length of your tie, let your trousers be the guide. A tie should always hit



the waistband of a trouser. Any lower and it'll get in the way, while too high looks cheap. And no, a clip-on tie is not the answer.

COLOUR

Like most things hanging in your wardrobe, colour is a major factor when deciding on a tie to wear. It's crucial to identify which hues work with your suit, your shirt, and also your skin tone.

The aim should always be for the tie to be at least one shade darker than the shirt it's paired with, but it is possible to make the whole process easier by keeping a few classic options to hand.

I'd always recommend sober, deeper shades [for ties] such as a blues or burgundy. Ties are a point of focus, so they're immediately noticeable and people often judge your character by them.

As for the shirt? You can't go wrong with crisp white, which makes a perfect blank canvas to set your chosen tie upon. If you're looking to start building a solid tie rotation, start with staple colours like navy and grey, which can be easily dressed up or down by your choice of shirt, then go beyond the normal by incorporating more saturated hues like green, yellow and

OCCASION

Knowing the occasion you are dressing for isn't just a style rule, it's a menswear commandment. Taking this into account with your tie can help avoid a cardinal sin.

Different ties suit different occasions, and they're subject to the same dress codes. As a general rule, silk ties in block colours are the most formal-hence why they are often sported in boardrooms – and as such don't lend themselves to much else than a suit.

In recent years, men looking to add a little flair to their tailoring have turned to knitted ties.

there's more opportunity to experiment - especially with a tie.

There are so many patterns, prints and textures to consider, but some combinations are easier than others.

(At first), stick to simple two-tone patterns like polka dots or stripes. These are much more muted in design, so are therefore easier to match with your shirt and tailoring.

You can also lessen the statement further by opting for a tonal look. For example, a navy suit, worn with a light blue shirt and a dark blue polka dot knitted tie.

For the more advanced



Owing to their more narrow design and squaredoff end, these are less formal and therefore versatile enough to be worn casually under a cardigan or even leather jacket.

In the case of black tie, the right necktie to wear is none. This isn't Hollywood, you're not a rock star or a movie producer - put on a bow tie.

PATTERNS AND PRINTS

You only need to look at the sheer number of men wearing sneakers with their suits to see that tailoring is a more relaxed affair than it was even five years ago.

That's not to say we should disregard what's worked for generations. It just means dresser, striped ties can be a great way of introducing colour, as there are always at least two shades to work with.

Go for a muted base with a contrasting stripe to pop against classic tailoring. So if you're in your favourite navy two-piece, try a blue and yellow club tie. Of course, it makes sense to swerve some patterns altogether.

A couple of trickier choices include tartans and paislevs.

Although they're commonly seen in men's accessories, the colour combinations make it tough to match, and they can be disastrous when clashed with other patterns in the outfit.

Seiko Prospex PADI Turtle (product code: SRPA21)

Seiko watches have always been making waves. Many professional divers actually use their watches at work. The Professional Association of Diving Instructors (PADI) is the world's leading scuba diver training organization. Both started out serving the diving industry in 1965,

Both started out serving the diving industry in 1965, and to celebrate this special relationship, Seiko announced two Special Edition pieces for the Prospex collection: the Seiko PADI Kinetic GMT's Diver (SUN065) and the Seiko PADI Automatic Diver's (SRPA21). The PADI SRPA21 watch closely resembles the SRP779K1, which sports a similar blue and red ("Pepsi") bezel, with a few minor changes. The

movement is the same 4R36 automatic movement. The case is pure "Turtle". The cushion shape which defined this nickname looks like it means serious business. On

wearing the watch, the impression of an awesome heft and purposeful ruggedness prevails. The

case is matt finished, but feels
smooth to the touch, like a
pebble which is weathered
the waves for ages. Even the
scoring on the sides of the
bezel to increase traction
for gloved fingers are not
sharp as some dive bezels
can be. As a comparison, the
Rolex Submariner comes to
mind, whose bezel edges are

The hands and markers have a thick layer of luminous material. Seiko does not specify, but it looks like the ubiquitous SuperLuminova. The lume glows very bright in the dark. The dial is also a deep blue hue, with what looks like an anodised finish with a beautiful play with light as it catches at different angles. You'll find this beautiful Seiko timepiece locally at Keanes for around €495.

Avoiding late night snacking

RE you an evening snacker? Trying to break the cycle of eating healthy all day binging in front of the TV in the evenings? Here are some tips that might help.

1: IDENTIFY THE DIFFERENCE **BETWEEN HUNGER AND BOREDOM**

The first thing to remember here is if you are hungry - you need to eat! I am not a fan of "dieting", I believe developing a good relationship with food is far more important. If the evenings are your downfall for reaching for unnecessary treats and snacks, learn first to tell whether you are bored, whether its just a habit you need to break or whether you are actually hungry. In which case you need to feed your body.

2: SET A TIME FRAME IN PLACE.

Tell yourself going forward there's no eating after a certain time (eg. 8pm). The

only way this can be deviated from is if you are having a late dinner. NEVER DINNER. But let dinner be your last meal.

Fill up on proteins and veg. Feel satisfied with clean food.

3: CHOOSE A HEALTHY SNACK

If you really are feeling hungry - as opposed to feeling bored or doing it out of

habit - choose options that won't undo your clean eating day. I like to have a couple of tablespoons of Greek Yoghurt with a little Whey Protein and some chopped nuts mixed in for flavour as a "dessert" (it tastes as good as Angel Delight!!). You could try some scrambled egg whites or cottage cheese too. Or some vegetable sticks with hummus. Don't go reaching for the cereal box. Cereal is often full of sugars (check the sugar content in the nutritional information) and not a good choice for a late night snack.

4: KEEP YOUR FOOD DIARY BESIDE YOU

By having your food log sitting there with you will probably be less likely to take trips to the fridge. Writing down what you eat each day makes it real and you'll probably opt for the cup of tea and leave the handful of biscuits where they are.

5: DISTRACT YOURSELF

Watching TV in the evenings can be the main cause of

a snack attack. Distract yourself in other ways. Take a walk with the dog, read a book or run a bath. If you do choose to watch TV there are ways you can "break the habit" by keeping yourself busy whilst doing so. Get to work on the foam roller to roll out any knots from your days workout, paint your nails, do some ironing! You may laugh but it works!

6: BRUSH YOUR TEETH

Once dinner is well and truly done, brush your teeth! It sounds simple but how often have you passed on something because you've just brushed your teeth and it would taste funny. I know I have!

Over-snacking problem for so many – including me at times. The main thing is to realise the difference between hunger and habit. Hunger must be fed, but habits must be broken. Hopefully you've taken something from this and one or two of these little tips will help.





Young Munster's AIL win - 25 years on

Munsters' capture top prize in Irish club rugby

THE ADVENT of the All-Ireland League at the start of the 1990s fundamentally changed the face of Irish

club rugby.
Young Munster initially began life in Division 2, with Michael Benson's dramatic drop goal securing their place in the second tier after a play-off with Highfield in

Munsters' duly secured promotion to the top Division at the first time of asking, keen to show their Limerick, Cork and Dublin rivals that they were worthy of their place at the top table in the club game.

Following a season of consolidation in the top flight, Munsters' band of brothers were primed for an assault on the top prize in club rugby as the 1992-1993 campaign dawned.

Munsters' win over inaugural AIL winners Cork Constitution and the then unbeaten League leaders at Temple Hill is widely regarded as a hugely significant day in their march to ultimate AIL glory.

On a filthy wet and windy day, Munsters' trailed by four points deep in the final quarter, but were battering away at the Con line.

However, a late try for the visitors changed the complexion of the game, the Greenfields side were now well placed to challenge for league honours.

Tony Grant's Young Munster side followed up on their win over Cork Con by downing Garryowen 13-6.

On the same afternoon Con crashed at home to St Mary's. Munsters and the Saints would meet in a winner take all fixture on the final day of the season in Dublin.

Well, not quite winnertake-all, a draw would do for St Mary's to lift the title. The game was moved from St Mary's Templeville Road ground to Lansdowne Road to cater for the enormous crowd wishing to see it.

In front of the largest attendance to ever watch a club game, 17,000, Munsters took the field.

They lost team captain Ger Clohessy to a niggling hamstring injury in the opening minutes. However, the Limerick side held their composure and led 6-3 when centre Francis Brosnihan was floored by a blow from St Mary's Kiwi number eight, Brent Pope.

Pope was duly sent off by match referee McHugh. Despite Munsters' having a one-man advantage,
