



# Will we ever take to the streets again?



Over 20,000 took to the streets in December 1987, but Barrington's Hospital still closed in 1988. Now a 60 bed modular block at University Hospital Limerick has been delayed following the over run of costs to the National Children's Hospital

readers remember back in 1987 when 20,000 people took to the streets to demonstrate over proposals to close Barringtons' Hospital.

It was opened in 1829 for the poor of Limerick. Willie O'Dea made headlines when voted against the government he was part of, which closed the facility. Now we face another crisis. This week it has been confirmed that the crucial €19.5 million 60 bed modular block will be delayed as a result of the financial overrun for the National Children's Hospital. So the trolley crisis, it seems, will get worse. We already have the worst overcrowding in the country.

What will Limerick politicians do about this? Not a lot, or so it seems at the moment. We have to be grateful to Clare TD Michael Harty, who highlighted the matter this week and described the delay as "a betrayal of trust".

He is supporting a vote of No confidence on Health Minister Simon Harris set to be held this Wednesday. Now the interesting thing is how will the Limerick TDs in FG and FF vote on this one?

# Mayor calls for respect at meeting

A HEATED exchange took place took place between councillors at a metropolitan district meeting about the allocation of €30,000 for the city's St Patrick's Day festivities.

Metropolitan Daniel Butler called for discussions took place discussions took place between himself and Cllr

Séighin Ó Ceallaigh.

The meeting ended with members of the local authority agreeing to give the allocation to this year's St Patrick's Day festival in Limerick - on top of the money the event will already get from the arts office.

However, Cllr Ó Ceallaigh was disapointed with the exclusion of the Limerick

Soviet Centenary.

"It is disappointing that the Limerick Soviet will not play a part. I was told that my motion that I brought before councill was not valid for some reason or another," he

The Sinn Fein councillor was then questioned by Cllr Butler as to what the Limerick Soviet had to do with the €30,000 allocation for the St Patrick's Festival.

"I know you weren't there mayor, I don't know what you were up to," said Cllr Ó Ceallaigh, referring to the meeting where the Limerick Soviet had been discussed.

"For those of us who were there, we had a serious discussion about what we wanted from this. You are disrupting my motion and you don't even know what you are talking about," Cllr Ó Ceallaigh added.

The metropolitan mayor called on the councillor to show respect.

"I show you courtesy and respect, I expect you to show Čllr Butler the same," retorted.

# 'Little Museum' of city planned for Pery Square

Culture: Members rubber-stamp plans to lease Georgian site

COUNCILLORS have rubber-stamped exciting proposals which could lead to the opening of a 'Little Museum of Limerick'.

At this month's metropolitan district meeting, members approved the lease of Culture House at number 2 Pery Square to the Limerick Civic Trust to transform the building into a visitor attraction.

In a document to members, director of services Gordon Daly said: "Limerick's Georgian quarter is an architectural gem and the biggest in Ireland outside Dublin. One of the strengths of this proposal lies in the ability of the Limerick Civic Trust to deliver a high quality product that enhanced the current offering both to the people of Limerick and to guests of

While the building would be leased to the heritage group, the local authority would still be entitled to use it for future civic events as required, he added.

The council's proposal would see the unit taken over on a long lease.

council has leased, and claimed some have been left out of use for an extended However, Mr Daly said as part of the

Number 2Pery Square was the headquarters of Limerick City of Culture during 2014, but, Mr Daly, says it's not currently accessible to the public. "The building and its garden needs attention, repair and an ongoing maintenance plan to be put in place. As a cultural and events space, the Georgian House played a key role in the year of Limerick City of Culture. There is an opportunity to build on this and reflect on the efforts made over the last number of years," the director added.

That's the view of Fianna Fail councillor Kieran O'Hanlon, a member of the environment committee, who has also welcomed the fact the local authority has invested in four devices to catch images from the sky. The scheme is in place as

 $part\, of\, a\, government$ initiative to tackle illegal dumping, with Limerick having the most drones - four – alongside Leitrim, whose football team they ironically play this Sunday.

Cllr O'Hanlon said: "I've been walking the footpaths throughout the city, and to see the dog-fouling going on is terrible. It would be great to catch the owners who do not clean up the mess after their dogs. It would be a marvellous idea. People are in wheelchairs, in buggies with prams. Ordinary

people are going to work and have dog poo on their shoes. It's absolutely disgraceful. I don't think it's very funny."

The use of drones was welcomed by fellow committee member Cllr Marian Hurley.

# Mungret has designs on new build

Education: One of Limerick's newest schools has its first official planning meeting

WITH plans to increase its future numbers to 800 students, Mungret Community College (MCC) recently held its first official planning meeting for its new school

building.
One of Limerick's newest secondary schools, MCC welcomed its first students in September 2017.

The new school building is expected to be finalised by the end of 2020, according to the chairperson of the school's board of management Metropolitan Daniel Butler.

"I'm delighted to see the design process now begin, that we can work towards delivering a new building for MCC," Mayor Butler said.

"It's a very exciting time," he added.

Ahead of the meeting, MCC students, along with

principal O'Mahoney and deputy principal Helen Ryan, got the opportunity to meet the design team.

Along with Mayor Butler. the students got the chance view plans of what is proposed for their brand new school.

"The school's principal Liam O'Mahoney and myself will be working very closely together on this project to ensure that we deliver it on time," Mayor Butler added.

"The end of 2020 has always been our target."

# Activist cross over the axing of trees

**Environment:** Complaint as greenery cut down

A LOCAL activist has made a complaint to Limerick City and County Council over the felling of trees

Green party local election candidate Sean Hartigan is appalled at the fact a number of trees and hedgerows appear to have been axed at a site in Castletroy.

He discovered this – ironically enough – after giving a talk to local children on the need to create homes and habitats for wildlife.

"That field is a huge habitat for wildlife. The amount of birds which would live in there, the bats which would have been in the trees – and the trees themselves would be absorbing carbon from the atmosphere and pumping in oxygen. We have 1% of native tree cover in this country and we need to retain absolutely everything we have," Mr Hartigan, Lisnagry, said.

He received his first call about the tree felling from a concerned and "horrified" parent, who he said,



compared the scene to Watership Down.

"I am still getting calls from people. There was one woman here early on Saturday when it started, and she said it was like Watership Down – rabbits running all over the place," Mr Hartigan added.

Mr Hartigan has written to council, as well as the National Parks and Wildlife Service, and Coiltte to

raise his concerns and enquire as to whether a felling licence was in place at the land.

"There were some oak trees and ash trees in there. There was one oak tree well over 150 years in there of up to two metres," he claimed, "We are talking about up to 300 metres of hedgerow, maybe up to 14 or 15 trees." Mr Hartigan claimed they were all removed over one weekend.

# Accord sees 2,783 couples attend therapy

MORE than 2,700 couples in the South West attended marriage and relationship counselling sessions with Catholic organisation Accord last year

According to the latest figures released by the Catholic agency, in 2018 2,783 couples attended

counselling through the service, which operates offices in both Limerick city and Newcastle West.

This compares to 3,129 couples in 2017.

A further 2,484 individuals also attended marriage preparation courses in the South West last year.

Nationally, 16,048 individuals attended sacramental marriage preparation courses with the Catholic organisation last year.

A further 24,180 couples received counselling with Accord for issues like lack of trust between partners or unresolved arguments.

# Minister Harris condemned for mid-2020 delay for UHL beds

The UL Hospitals Group has confirmed that it is hoped that a €19.5m 60-bed project will be completed by mid-2020, despite the Government's hopes to have it ready by autumn 2019.

up front" about the
important project that
will act as an interim
measure, prior to the
delivery of a 96-bed
project, sometime in the
2020s.

"It is completely unacceptable that

patients and staff will have to go through another winter in an overcrowded hospital that is not capable of catering for the numbers of people in attendance."

Mayor James Collins said "the constant spin cycle from Fine Gael won't wash", adding that the political party "has proven that it can't manage public finances".

"Dolores is an exceptionally worthy winner of Limerick's All Time Great," said Eugene Phelan, editor of The Leader



# Retired soldier was robbed in laneway

Injured: Pensioner cut after being hit with knife

A RETIRED soldier was attacked and robbed at a laneway in the city centre after he was lured there by a woman who phoned him while he was socialising, a court has heard.

Details of the incident, which

happened a year ago, emerged during the sentencing hearing of a couple who have admitted targeting the vulnerable pensioner.

Fintan Lynch, 39, and Christine O'Grady, 30, both of Parnell Place, Limerick, have each pleaded guilty to a robbery charge relating to an incident which happened at Hunt's Lane, off Dominick Street, on February 22, 2018.

Detective Garda Shane Ryan said the then 75-year-old victim was attending a function at a city hotel when he went outside having received a phone call from O'Grady.

He said both walked to the laneway where Lynch then attacked the victim from behind - knocking him to the ground.

A knife was held to his neck and he sustained a cut under his left arm when he was struck with the knife.

Det Garda Ryan told John O'Sullivan BL, prosecuting, the culprits took the victim's wallet which contained around €200.

Extensive CCTV was obtained and the movements of the culprits tracked around the time of the

The mobile phone used to phone the pensioner was also recovered at O'Grady's home.

In a victim impact statement, the victim's daughter said he became "withdrawn and very quiet" following the incident and stopped going out.

"It took a lot out of him, he was just not himself," she said.

Barristers representing each of the defendants said their clients

wished to apologise for their actions on the night.

Both, Limerick Circuit Court was told, have previous convictions and suffer from addiction issues.

Jack Nicholas BL said Lynch is now taking a different approach in life and is making efforts to address his addiction issues. Eimear Carey BL said O'Grady – a mother of two – is doing well in prison and is now "drug free and looking well".

Judge O'Donnell said the matter was "a very serious case in my view" and he adjourned sentencing to

# Recidivist is facing extra time in prison

A repeat offender is facing the prospect of additional time in prison after he pleaded guilty to multiple theft and burglary charges, writes

David Hurley.
Gerard O'Neill, 23, of New Crescent Halting Site, Childers Road, is already serving a four year sentence – which was imposed last summer - for a spate of burglary offences.

Giving evidence at Limerick Circuit Court, Sergeant Fergal Hanrahan said the defendant stole a CCTV system, worth €831.20 "off the shelf" at Maplin, Childers Road Retail Park, on March 26, 2018.

Mr O'Neill, he said, attempted to

break into a house on the Dublin Road on April 11, 2018; broke into a commercial premises in Ballysimon on April 21, 2018 and entered a student house in Castletroy on April 18, 2018.

Sgt Hanrahan said a young woman was in the house at the time and that the defendant had entered the house while armed with a screwdriver.

Following a brief encounter with the woman, he escaped with a number of laptops which were never

recovered. Judge Tom O'Donnell was told Mr O'Neill was on bail at the time and

that any sentence he receives must be

consecutive to the sentence he is currently serving.

Yvonne Quinn BL said there was no forensic evidence in the case and submitted her admissions and guilty plea was important.

She said he suffers from mental health issues and was using drugs around the time of the offences.

"He is a vulnerable person, he presents as immature," she said urging the court to consider the principal of proportionality when determining the appropriate sentence.

Judge O'Donnell adjourned the matter to June.



# What should you do over a pension transfer offer?

ver the past 12 months, I've been contacted by a large number of people, looking for help and advice in relation to a defined benefit type pension they have or had with an employer of theirs.

The reason they reached out for help is because they have been offered an enhanced transfer value (ETV) in exchange for the pension their employer promised to pay them when they reach retirement age.

And they want to know should they accept or decline the offer?

The reason companies are offering ETVs is Defined Benefit pensions have too expensive become economically unviable to continue.

There are risks to taking an ETV and risks in staying in the DB scheme, you just have to be aware of what they are. Once you know and compare the advantages and disadvantages of each, you can make a more informed decision about which is best for you.

- 1. You have a fixed income for life, with no need to worry about investing the ETV amount and no need to worry
- about how markets perform in future.
  2. The value of the DB payable is much greater than the ETV offer.
- 3. Your preserved benefit may increase in line with inflation/CPI

There are, however, potential disadvantages should you remain in a DB scheme as well.

1. If you remain in a DB scheme, it could be wound up and you may not end up getting the full deferred pension at retirement age. If the scheme runs into

financial difficulties in the future, you could see your deferred pension cut via a S.50 order, as part of a restructuring of the scheme, with no floor to the cut which could be made. For example, some deferred pensions in Aer Lingus had their value reduced by between 45% and 60% as part of a restructuring of their DR scheme.

- 2. The scheme could be wound up and a transfer value offered which could be significantly less than what you are being offered now, and you would have no option but to accept it.
- 3. In retirement, even after the pension becomes payable, there is still a risk of a reduction in pension if the scheme was wound up or restructured. 4. If you were to die, a significant
- portion of your pension could die with you which is obviously not ideal for passing on your benefits to your family.

I now want to outline what I consider are the merits of taking an ETV.

- 1. If transfer value is enough, it could, depending on returns, pay a higher income than the DB pension.
- 2. If you avail of an ETV offering, you can pass on the value of it in death i.e. it goes into your estate and can be passed
- to your spouse/children/family.
  3. You have much more flexibility and control over your income in retirement. By investing your ETV in a Personal Retirement Bond which will become an Approved Retirement Fund (ARF) when you begin to take benefits from it, you can dictate the amount you draw down from it each year to meet one off expenses. With a DB pension, you don't have that flexibility.
  - 4. By taking control of your pension

# DID YOU KNOW?

The worst colour to wear at an interview is orange. According to a survey carried out by CareerBuider, hiring managers said it was the one colour they associated most with unprofessionalism. in retirement, it removes the uncertainty over what your future income might become in retirement i.e. you are not impacted if the DB scheme decides to adjust the benefit payable to its members or not.

5. Taking the ETV and investing it via an ARF, this mechanism can allow you (a) access to your fund earlier than a DB pension and (b) you have the potential for a higher tax-free lump sum.

6. The value of your fund can increase over time with the return on the investment strategy.

7. Even if the transfer value doesn't translate into the exact amount a DB pension might, you may have access to other sources of income i.e. rental income, and when combined with the ETV income, it is more than sufficient from a cash flow perspective.

Another question asked is do you  $wait\,and\,see\,i\hat{f}the\,ETV\,gets\,bigger?\,If\,the$ solvency position of the DB scheme remains the same, the ETV offer would be expected to increase for each year you wait to take your deferred pension.

However, there are a few things that could upset this increase.

If investment markets dropped significantly in the meantime and the solvency position of the scheme deteriorated the transfer value might actually be cut.

Secondly, if the scheme fails to meet the funding standard, there could be a cut in deferred pensions and hence a cut in the transfer value available.

Lots to consider and it's important you get external advice from a trusted source, not someone involved with the DB pension scheme because there may be a conflict of interest.

# ASK LIAM

Our personal finance expert answers your questions ...

Q: I'm considering taking out a life assurance policy, but really unsure about which type to take out. I'm 60 and think I only need cover until I'm 75. When the policy comes to an end, are all the premiums I paid lost? I know I'm paying for the cover, but wondering if I can get any of the premiums I paid back?

A: The good news is that you can. There is a policy that has been launched by Royal London which is ideal for anyone, but especially for people of your age and older, and it's called their Whole of Life Changes Plan.

You have two options once the policy is in place 15

You can discontinue the policy but get back 70% of the premiums you paid or stop paying the premiums but continue with a reduced level of cover.

If the cost of your new policy is, say, €100 each month for €60,000 cover, and after 15 years you want to cancel the policy, you have two options, you can either:

Get a guaranteed refund of €12,700 (€100 x 180 x 70%)

Or stop paying premiums but life cover in the amount of €18,000 continues until you reach the age of 100.

It's an excellent policy and one I would recommend for you.

# Anger at delay on shopping centre plan

Retail: An Bord Pleanala moves key decision back to next month

THERE is a fresh delay to a decision on a multi-million euro proposal to double the footprint of a suburban shopping

In plans exclusively revealed by our sister newspaper, the Limerick Leader, Castletroy Town Centre bosses are seeking to significantly expand the footprint of the shopping centre near the Kilmurry Roundabout.

After the application was turned down by council planners, the applicant UGP Castletroy appealed the decision to An Bord Pleanala.

But now, in correspondence seen by Senator Maria Byrne, it has emerged the national appeals body has delayed making a decision on the scheme.

Ms Byrne is severely critical of the delay to the process, which now means it won't be decided upon until after Tuesday, March 12.

"Delays from An Bord Pleanála on deciding on the Castletroy Town Centre expansion are unacceptable, Castletroy's population is expected to hit 24,000 people by 2022, this will make it bigger than the current population of County towns such as Tralee, Portlaoise, Clonmel, Sligo and Athlone," Ms Byrne pointed out.

The main plank of the council's decision to deny planning permission was the perceived negative impact the centre might have on the city centre.

But Ms Byrne said: "I can't see why the Castletroy Town Centre expansion plans can't proceed in tandem with the regeneration of the city centre. Castletroy is a growing community and facilities need to be in place for the people who live in the area. Castletroy Town Centre is unique in that it also caters to the retail needs of many of UL's 11,600 students and 1,300 staff, the 80 organisations employing 4,000+ people at the National Technology Park, and the Troy Studios film and television studios, all within a 15-minute walk of Castletroy Town Centre."

She argued the proposals do not

materially contravene the strategy for the Mid-West region, the Limerick County Development Plan, or the Limerick City Development Plan."

Social Democrats candidate Sarah Jane Hennelly added, "Anyone who lives in Castletroy knows how nice it is to have the centre there, the convenience and the community feel around the place. It's worth building on. Objectors to expansion argue that growth in the Castletroy centre would detract from city centre development. It doesn't cite progress to pit the city centre against a growing suburb like Castletroy.

"Analysing trends and projected patterns in population growth is the best approach to planning. The city centre was on its knees long before the Castletroy Centre was built. There is no causal link between the two. Castletroy is expanding rapidly, that is an undeniable trend. If we ignore that, like we ignored trends in the city, then we are left with a firefight, accommodating growth retrospectively. That is poor planning."

# **Teckro** raises

CITY firm Teckro has raised \$25m in funding that it says will help it speed up clinical trials to fight world's most complex diseases.

The company, founded and headquartered in Limerick city with offices in Dublin and in Nashville, said the fresh round of financing would accelerate its aim of helping to bring drugs and treatments to market quicker and more efficiently.

The life sciences company, which operates out

Teckro's total funding now stands at \$43m - around €38.2m.

It uses machine learning technologies to improve the speed and accuracy of clinical trials.

# Putting patients at ease a vital string in Robert's bow

#### What time do you get up?

I get up at 7 am. In the winter I make coffee and go back to bed for 20 mins, read the news and check emails. In the summer I'll go for a run or a row before work.

#### What is your normal breakfast?

Coffee, porridge and fruit.

#### Do you go for a walk or to the gym before/after the office?

I'll go for a run round the North Circular Road or go down to St Michael's Rowing Club. It's good to get the mind and body going in the morning. Ideally I like to meet one of my lads so it's social too.

#### You arrive at the office at what time?

8.15am.

#### What are your first duties?

We have a morning huddle with the staff. I make sure all the checklists for patients that day are completed. I'll see my first patient at 8.30am.

#### How many cups of coffee/tea would you drink a day?

Three. I love the stuff but I don't drink it after 6 pm, otherwise I'd be up all night.

## What is normal lunch - do you have a favourite place?

Yes. I often but not always have a wrap with roast chicken coleslaw, cheese, tomato and onion, toasted. I like the Maldron Hotel next door or else We will do coffee around the corner.

#### Do you have many meetings during the day?

I am generally busy assessing and treating patients all day. I'll have a daily meeting with the manager at lunchtime or the end of the day. Any other meetings will be after work.

#### What time do you finish up at?

Generally 6pm. It could be later if I have meetings or need to plan cases on our software and I like to finish a bit early on a Friday if it's possible!

#### Do you watch much television?



Not during the week. I love watching TV on a Sunday night. I am enjoying that drama Rebellion at the moment on RTÉ

#### Do you read the newspapers?

Yes. I read the local newspapers, the Irish Times and the New York Times online.

#### What do you do to relax?

Exercise. You can't beat it for burning off stress. If I can get out in a boat with the lads from the rowing club that is even better. I really love taking my son Daniel to swimming lessons. It's very satisfying to see him improve week to week.

#### Are you able to leave the office behind?

I have to say I find it hard. I am treating patients all day so it is the evening when you have time to think about planning

their treatment in detail. I will often use our software and 3D models to ascertain what is the best treatment.

#### What is a perfect work day?

I love doing All-on-4 teeth in a day. These patients usually have had ongoing dental problems for years, and with the skills and facilities in the clinic we can rehab them in just one day!

I place implants in the morning, teeth are made in our dental engineering department in the afternoon and we fit them in the evening. I love this work because it makes a huge difference to the patient's quality of life and it can be done in one day so they are never without teeth. It is life changing. I get a real kick out if this.



# Getting to the root of skin

have a special interest in chronic skin conditions, Lsince the route that took me to nutritional therapy was a struggle with my own

One of the most common conditions I see is eczema, and no wonder, according to the Irish Skin Foundation, one in five children and one in 12 adults suffer with it in Ireland - no doubt due to the lack of sunshine, vitamin D and the damp weather which tend to make symptoms

worse.

Eczema is a term coming from the Greek "to boil" that connect many different non-contagious inflammatory skin disorders. It is named depending on the site, the triggering factors and the rate of immune system involvement. Contact dermatitis for example is limited to the area where the contact to chemicals or nickel repeatedly happeni.e. the hands / earlobe.

Seborrheic dermatitis is limited to the face and scalp, most often linked to fungal organisms overgrowth.

Atopic dermatitis is the most common in children, it literally means

"hypersensitivity skin inflammation" – and it may affect the entire body. It may start in infancy and change to other atopic conditions such as asthma or hay fever later on, or lasts into

adulthood, accompanied by those other two. But it may also start in adulthood after a major triggering event.

The skin functions as a barrier, protecting us from the outside world and keeps lipids and water inside, keeping it well hydrated and

In eczema there is a problem with this barrier, allowing chemicals to penetrate the deep layers where the immune cells initiate inflammation, causing redness and itching, and there is a loss of moisture, which makes the skin dry and scaly.

Conventional treatments are limited to the skin and symptom control. However. the root of the problem - as with many chronic inflammatory disorders involving the immune system lays in the gut. There might be a genetic component, involving genes

that code for proteins that build the barrier molecules or involved in skin shedding, making these individuals more susceptible - but it is always the environment that turns on these faulty genes.

As with the immune system, the barrier functions are also regulated by the microbes that live inside our

Several clinical trials have shown that oral probiotic supplementation reduced the symptoms of atopy - both hay fever and eczema, because it improved the skin and nasal passage barrier functions and regulated the immune system, reducing reactions.

Once the barrier is strengthened, it is of the utmost importance to find what is the individual cause. This of course may be different for everyone, so a thorough investigation is the only way to find your root!

# A guide to dress codes at weddings

edding dress codes seem like a nice idea, That is, until you receive an invitation for a "semiformal" wedding and neither you or anyone else that's invited have any idea what you're actually supposed to wear.

I've been there and I know a lot of my friends and Instagram followers have too because I frequently get DMs asking me to translate and make sense of wedding dress codes. So to put an end to the confusion, once and for all, I've put together a list of the most common dress codes and a guide to what they actually mean. Keep this guide and you will never go wrong.

Black tie means highly formal and basically means tuxedo. You'll need to read the situation somewhat in terms of what you can play around with here. A sure-fire winner is black peak lapel tux. Colour variations, shawl necks and other stylistic details work well for New Year's balls and red carpets but at a very traditional black tie wedding they will not be welcomed so stick to black and you can't really go wrong. Black tie also means bow tie (although you can opt for a straight necktie but it's not recommended). Your shirt should be double cuffed which you can wear with cufflinks. You can also go for studs for your shirt in place of buttons (but it's not a deal breaker) and you have options like a

waistcoat or cummerbund and a white pocket square if you wish to accessorize. Your shows should be black and polished and your socks should also be black.

WHITE TIE

White tie is the most formal of dress codes and it quite literally means wearing a white tie. Your suit will be an evening tailcoat and trousers. Kind of like a tuxedo only fancier. The jacket, the underpinnings and the shirt should all be white. You'll need studs and cufflinks too. For your shoes, go for the most formal options. A polished shoe in patent leather will do the trick.

BLACK TIE OPTIONAL

In plain English: you have the option black tie or the option of another formal suit. If you opt for black tie (tuxedo) then all the same black tie rules apply, but now you can get with a little bit more. If you don't go for the black-tie option then look to the most formal suit you have in a darker colour. Keep your accessories as simple as possible because there will other people there in full black tie regalia so even if you're not, you don't want to look out of place.

SEMIFORMAL

Semiformal means no tux, but you are wearing a suit and tie. As I've covered many times already, the type of suit will depend on the location and time of year. If it's semiformal during the winter months, you'll want darker colours and heavier fabrics. If it's spring or summer and/or held outside, you'll likely see less black and dark navy and more blue, light grey or beige. But the jacket and trousers should match, and you should be wearing a formal shirt. The level of formality here is best described as medium to medium-high so you will also need to wear a tie. Also, make sure to match your belt with your shoes. It might seem obvious but you'd be shocked by how often people get it wrong.

COCKTAII.

The cocktail dress code was invented to bridge the gap between casual day wear and formal evening wear. So a suit, but you can make it fun (within reason). 'Suit' has a looser definition here. You can mix and match, like proper trousers with a different colour blazer. Depending on the venue, coloured trousers might be an option. You do still need to wear a collared shirt but you don't necessarily need to wear a tie. A blazer with a pocket square is a good alternative. You can definitely play with colour, both in the outfit and in the accessories. As for shoes, you could do a lace-up or maybe even a loafer.

BEACH FORMAL

Even where you see the word 'beach', if you see the word "formal" in a dress code, it means wear a suit and tie. For a beach wedding, you can move away from the darker colours usually associated with formal weddings and play around with light summery colours and

semiformal wrong

linen fabrics. You should still wear a tie or a pocket square. For your feet, while might be walking near sand and water, that's no excuse to wear sandals or anything else you wouldn't otherwise be wearing to a formal event. Light colours and shoes you can wear sockless are a good choice here.

DRESSY CASUAL

"Dressy" is the hint that shorts and trainers are not OK. Even if they're fancy expensive ones. You don't necessarily have to wear a suit. You could go for trousers or nice smart chinos. Up top, you could wear a crewneck with a blazer, or just a button-down shirt. A tie is not required here but be careful with your choice of shoe. You might think your "dressy trainers" are perfect. The couple might not. Err on the side of caution.

With a casual dress code, you

It might seem obvious but you'd be shocked by how often people get can get away with a more relaxed ensemble, but it needs to look refined because you're still going to a wedding, after all. You could wear a pair of well-fitting dark jeans (no rips) and a button-down. You could

wear a pair of chinos, a t-shirt, and a blazer. For your shoes, keep them polished. You can finally bust out those dressy trainers, or a nice pair of loafers. No running tackies or anything "street style".

NONSTANDARD

You're going to have to depend on the hosts to give some sort of guidance here. If you are hosting, add a line about what you're expecting ("Cowboy hats welcome" or "Saints and Sinners" etc). If you're the guest, don't be afraid to ask. When in doubt, dress a little more formally. It's much better to go with a suit and tie-where you can take off the jacket and tie—than to not have the option at





A BUMPER crowd is expected in the Gaelic Grounds on Sunday for another hurling and camogie league double-header.

Both Limerick inter-county teams bring a three match unbeaten league record into GAA Headquarters for the eagerly awaited ties.

The Limerick and Cork repeat of last Summer's epic All-Ireland SHC semi final has a 2.30pm start and for the first time this season won't feature on the television matchday coverage.

Sunday is the first Limerick-Cork meeting in the group stages of the league since 2014 - when they drew o-17 each in Pairc Ui Rinn.

The last Limerick-Cork league tie in the Gaelic Grounds was 2010 but Limerick's last win over Cork in the group phase of the league was back in 1993. The sides have met eight times since - Cork winning seven and one draw.

The men in green are

already all but assured of a place in the knockout stages but John Kiely's men are aware that victory in either of their two remaining group games would seal a top of the table finish and therefore a quarter final against the fourth placed team in Division 1B, where Dublin, Carlow, Laois or Offaly are all possibilities.

Limerick would have home advantage against Carlow or Dublin but would have to toss for home advantage with Laois or Offaly Limerick will be forced into at least two changes from the win over Kilkenny with Aaron Gillane and Paddy O'Loughlin to be rested due to their Fitzgibbon Cup final this Saturday.

In the camogie curtain-raiser, Limerick and Kilkenny battle for top spot in their group - throw-in will be 12.15 in the Gaelic Grounds. Both have already qualified for the semi finals and Sunday's final round group games in the Littlewoods Ireland Camogie League will determine the semi final

line-up with Galway and Cork also to feature.

On Saturday, both the Limerick senior footballers and the Limerick ladies footballers are in league action.

In Kilmallock, Limerick play Leitrim in round four of Division Four of the Allianz Football League, while in Ederney, Co. Fermanagh the Lidl Ladies Football league tie between Limerick and Fermanagh takes place at 2.30. Billy Lee's footballers have two wins from three starts to-date.

Nine different Limerick players were involved before a Barry Murphy point put Limerick 14-points clear in Nowlan Park.


