this year a further change was made with the weekend moving from August, the month in which Kickham died, to May, the month in which he was born in 1828.

The consensus was that there was too much usually on in August and holidays and other cultural events were taking a toll on festival attendances. The switch to the May date was also to facilitate our primary schools and help both pupils and teachers to become involved in learning about our best known historic figure.

HSE under pressure after settling Vicky Phelan lawsuit for €2.5 million

Last week, Vicky Phelan, settled her High Court action against the HSE after she was given incorrect smear test results and is now terminally ill with cervical cancer.

BREACH OF TRUST

Speaking outside court Ms Phelan said that her case was "unforgivable" and an "appalling breach of trust". She also stated that "There are no winners here today. I'm terminally ill and my cancer is incurable."

Vicky Phelan's cervical cancer misdiagnosis first came to light in 2014 following an audit of all smear tests. Separately, the same year, she underwent a second smear test which revealed she had cervical cancer. Her doctor wasn't told about her misdiagnosis dating from 2011 until 2016, and she wasn't informed until a further year had passed.

It is with alarm that we have now heard RTE report this morning that, an audit of the Cervical Check programme has revealed that 12 of the 206 women whose cases were pinpointed in a review have died, while around half of this number could have potentially have be-nefited from earlier treatment and were not told about



this diagnostic delay.

Women who have been affected by this scandal have not been all notified and the HSE and Minister Harris have now said the women affected will be notified as soon as possible.

CERVICAL CANCER SYMPTOMS

Women with early cervical cancers and pre-cancers usually have no symptoms.

Symptoms often do not begin until the cancer becomes invasive and spreads into nearby tissue. When this happens, the most common symptoms are:

Abnormal vaginal bleeding, such as bleeding after vaginal sex, bleeding after menopause, bleeding spotting between periods, and having (menstrual) periods that are longer heavier than usual. Bleeding after douching or after a pelvic exam may also

An unusual discharge from the vaginathe discharge may contain some blood and may occur between your periods or after menopause.

Pain during sex.



SOLVING A SNIPE MYSTERY

Wildlife Matters Albert Nolan

recently received an email from a lady who had a mystery and she was hoping I might be able to help solve it.

Like me, she loves to ramble through the countryside and see what wildlife is out and about. Every so often a bird flies up to her with a sharp call and quickly flies away. She was very curious as to the name of this bird. Her email contained a few good clues, and I already had a few ideas of what it could be. The first idea was that the bird could be found in wet rushy meadows, with $her \, description \, of the \, call \, and \,$ sudden flight pointing me in the right direction.

I emailed her back a photo and the bird in question was a snipe. These are a common species on marshy ground that have lots of rushes. During the very cold winter of 2010, I found them along the river bank in Tipperary town. They had come in to search for food and perhaps to benefit from the lifesaving, slightly higher temperatures generated in an urban envirgence.

onment

Snipes are a bulky bird with a very long straight bill that looks completely out of proportion. Their legs are short, and they have buff and dark stripes running down their bodies. These provide perfect camouflage and have even give rise to a human term 'sniper', which means a person in the military or a hunter who is very good at concealing themselves.

Snipes are a popular game bird, posing a challenge even to the most experienced marksman. They are a very sulking bird, and wait for the last second before exploding from cover.

On many a walk, snipes have taken the heart out of me, and I don't know who gets the bigger fright. They fly erratically from side to side, and this style is probably learned from generations of avoiding the gun.

the gun.

The nest is built on the ground and concealed by a tussock of grass or rushes.

Two to four eggs are laid, which hatch out after around

three weeks. Because the nest is on the ground they are vulnerable to predators, and the chicks quickly disperse but are still fed by their parents.

Snipes enjoy a protein rich diet that consists of soil invertebrates, flies and the larva of many insects. They probe in the soil and their beak is extremely sensitive. They relay back detailed information and literally see underground.

On a hot summer's evening, I like to stand outside and listen. My house is surrounded by marshy land and a few pairs of snipes nest there. During display flight, they make the most unusual bleating sound that is like a goat. This is caused by very stiff hairs that stick out of the side of the tail and vibrate in the air. While I can hear them passing overhead, it is usually too dark to get anything more

than a fleeting glance of the bird. This had led to countryside names like 'bog bleater' and 'she goat of the air'. I am sure there are countless more, but these are the two I am most familiar with. If any reader knows another name please get in touch.

The snipe's scientific name, Gallinago Gallinago, comes from Latin and means hen that resembles a woodcock. In Irish it is called Naoscach, translting to scary and probably comes of its habit of suddenly flying out from cover. Long ago when people would cross fields at night, snipes must have scared the life out of them.

Sparing your pet from pests

Parasites are not only a pest but they can make life hell for a cat or a dog. This is because they cause severe itching or even trigger an allergy, such as from flea bites. So, it's a good thing to protect your house pet from these pests and yourself too as some parasites migrate to humans

There is no prevention against internal parasites. Worms, which your canine companion can pick up from nosing around outside, are among the internal parasites. The malicious thing about worms - which can be hookworm, whipworm, tapeworm or lungworm - is that they don't harm the animal until the infestation is massive.

You can protect your pet only through regular worming medication.

It's especially those animals which ingest a lot outdoors or catch mice that should be 'wormed' every quarter year as any fox tapeworms they might eat can be transmitted to humans.

Giardia is an example of the protozoa parasite. These intestinal parasites can be picked up by a cat or dog when they drink from a puddle, for instance. The consequence can be severe diarrhea which must be treated by the vet.





Presentation of Cheque for 'Daffodil Day 2018'

A cheque for €10,400 was presented McMahon, Irish Cancer Society Community Fundraiser for Munster, at the Nano Nagle Community Resource Centre on 11th April The amount was raised from donations and events on Daffodil Day in Carrick-on-Suir, Portlaw and all the surrounding environs on Friday 23rd March. Nicola thanked everyone for helping out and said that it could not be done without the dedication of volunteers, including local secondary school students, and the generosity of all local people. A poster was made showing the amount raised from 2000 - 2017 from Carrick and all neighbouring environs, which totaled over €200,000. Committee member, Brendan Mulvaney paid tribute to members who had passed away over the last year and who had worked tirelessly with the Daffodil Day Committee for many years, remembering, Mary Butler, Peggy Cooney, Josephine O'Brien, PJ O'Neill and Peggy Reade.

Most recent data from the National Cancer Registry of Ireland shows that on average 1,157 people in County Tipperary receive a cancer diagnosis each year. The breakdown of the most common cancers in Tipperary include: (372 nonmelanoma skin cancer), (118 breast cancer), (132 prostate cancer), (76 lung cancer), (92 colorectal cancer), (42 melanoma skin cancer).

Our Freephone Cancer Nurseline 1800 200 700 answered 3,656 enquiries in 2017, with 51 enquiries from Tipperary. The Nurseline is staffed by Cancer Nurses, Monday – Friday from 9am to 5pm, to provide confidential support and information to anyone affected by cancer.

The Society sent 625 cancer information booklets and leaflets free of charge to Tipperary, while a total of 327,062 were distributed nationally. Information on cancer, prevention and support also available on www.cancer.ie

90 cancer patients in Tipperary received 375 nights of care through the Society's Night Nursing service. Over the course of 2017 Night Nurses provided 7,345 nights of care to 1,818 patients around the country, in their homes.

911 journeys were facilitated for 71 patients from Tipperary who used the Volunteer Driver Service. The Service currently operates in 23 hospitals around the country and transports patients to and from their chemotherapy treatment. Nationally drivers clocked up over 1.2 million kilometres as they facilitated 12,156 journeys for 1,345 patients.

The Society funded counselling sessions for 76 people from Tipperary to help them cope with a cancer diagnosis in their life. A total of €361,000 was granted the Society's affiliated cancer support centres around the country, facilitating over 1,600 counselling sessions.

Grants totalling € 3,000 were provided to 4 families in Tipperary through the Society's Financial Support Programme which supports parents of children who are undergoing cancer treatment and experiencing financial hardship. Financial Support to the value of €166,000 was provided to 197 cancer patients across the country.

91 patients from Tipperary were granted a total of €27,021 from the Travel2Care transportation assistance fund made available by the National Cancer Control Programme (NCCP) and administered by the Irish Cancer Society. This fund is available to patients travelling to the eight designated cancer care centres in Ireland. In total 1,131 patients were assisted with transport costs to the sum of €361,157 in 2017.


