New 50-bed centre to replace St. Anthony's Unit in Clonmel

The HSE has submitted a planning application to build a new 50-bed residential centre for the elderly in Clonmel to replace the existing St. Anthony's Unit on the Western Road.

The project is part of the government's plan to replace or upgrade up to 90 long-stay residential care centres nationwide to meet all Health Information and Quality Authority (HIQA) standards.

It will increase the number of HSE residential care beds for the elderly in Clonmel by 29, as the current St. Anthony's Unit has 21 beds.

Tipperary County Council received the application for the two-storey 4,422 square metres community nursing and residential care unit on August 12. The application is currently at the pre-validation stage.

According to the application, the new residential care unit will comprise 50 en suite bedrooms with dining rooms, kitchenettes, day rooms, sun rooms, an activities room and quiet rooms.

It's proposed the unit will also have a family overnight room, a treatment room,

hairdressing room and internal courtyards and first floor terrace spaces, a kitchen and laundry, staff accommodation and office space.

The HSE is proposing access to the residential care unit from a four-arm roundabout on the Glenconnor Road, which will involve the realignment of the existing entrance and boundary walls

to South Tipperary General Hospital.

The roundabout will require the demolition of a derelict house called Hillview and two outbuildings.

The residential care unit will be served by a 26 square metres ESB sub-station.

The application also proposes the existing road adjacent to the Western Road will become pedestrian only.

A HSE spokesperson said it is currently considering developing the new Clonmel residential care unit for the elderly under the Public Private Partnership model.

Deputy Seamus Healy has welcomed the submission of the planning application, which was expected.

The project was announced in 2017.

Major expansion planned for Cashel Community School

A multi-million euro development for Cashel Community School was announced last week.

The major funding for the school has been welcomed by the principal John Gallagher and the chairman of the board of management Roger Kennedy.

Commenting on the proposed development, Mr Gallagher said that it will provide the school and the wider community with greatly enhanced facilities and infrastructure.

"We, as a school community are delighted by the opportunities that this will afford our students. We cater for diversity and offer a broad range of learning opportunities which nurture the development of responsible young adults".

Mr Gallagher continued by stating that "we are the victims of our own success" and outlined that the school has grown with the community over its lifetime. The building was initially designed to cater for 500 students.

The school quickly grew and required an extension which housed six new classrooms

with no additional accommodation for services or internal recreation areas.

Current enrolment stands at 860 (445 boys and 415 girls) with a projected enrolment of 865 next year. The demand far exceeds the capacity of the current building. He said the school is the largest in Tipperary and this commitment from the government will allow it to continue its growth.

Cllr Roger Kennedy described the announcement as "wonderful news for the school and the local community. It affirms Cashel Community School as a centre of excellence for education".

He continued by noting that this announcement "affords us the capacity to provide the enhanced learning environment which this community deserves".

The programme of improvements provides for additional accommodation comprising four general classrooms, one specialised room, offices, two SEN Classrooms within a designated SEN suite and a garden.

Mr Kennedy said this will come as welcome news to parents and future students.

New support group for dealing with breathlessness

A new peer support group for those with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in the South Tipp area is to be launched at an open day in Clonmel.

Taking place on Monday, September 2 from 10.30am to 1pm in the Mick McCarthy Millennium Centre (Moyle Rovers GAA grounds), the group is aimed at people living with breathlessness their family members and carers from South Tipperary and surrounding areas.

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is the name for a collection of lung diseases including chronic bronchitis, emphysema and chronic obstructive airways disease.

COPD is one of the most common respiratory diseases in Ireland. It usually affects people over the age of 35.

People with COPD have trouble breathing in and out. This is referred to as airflow obstruction. Breathing difficulties are caused by long-term damage to the lungs (usually because of smoking).

The open day in Clonmel will introduce a peer support and exercise group for people living with breathlessness

secondary to COPD, asthma or related respiratory condition.

It is a collaboration between the HSE/South East Community Healthcare's Health and Wellbeing team, people living with breathlessness in South Tipperary, the COPD Support Ireland organisation and the South Tipperary General Hospital

(STGH) respiratory services team.

The initiative, which has been successful as a model in Wexford, is supported by a HSE/National Lottery grant from South East Community Health Care (SECH).

Among those addressing the open day will be Kate Killeen White (Chief Officer, SECH), Maria Barry (General

Manager, STGH), Kate O'Connor (Self Management Support coordinator for chronic disease, SECH) and Eleanor Wall.

Eleanor Wall has been living with breathlessness and is a graduate of the Pulmonary Rehabilitation Programme at STGH (which has been co-ordinated at the hospital since 2001 by senior res-

piratory physiotherapist Angela Radley O'Donovan.

Speaking ahead of the open day, Eleanor Wall said:

"I was in a wheelchair and struggling to speak going into pulmonary rehabilitation. After pulmonary rehab, I am back on my feet walking and have no problem speaking and I am looking forward to encouraging others to exercise at this support group for South Tipp."

In addition to the open day, the group will run, ongoing, on Tuesdays 11am-12pm at the same venue (Moyle Rovers GAA Club)."

Kate Killeen White, chief officer of South East Community Healthcare, said the South Tipperary COPD peer support and exercise group will provide weekly fun exercise classes and an opportunity for people living with breathlessness to learn more about how to manage their condition from each other and local health care and community professionals.

Maria Barry, General Manager, STGH, says it will be a much needed community support that will assist patients and their families to exercise, be smoke free, and look after their physical and mental health while having fun and making friends.

Cashel delight as work on town's new playground is now finished

€100,000 approved for Ardfinnan playground

Funding of over €100,000 has been approved for a new playground in Ardfinnan. Mayor of Clonmel Garret Ahearn has confirmed that Ardfinnan Community Council has been approved LEADER funding of €101,230.57 towards the construction of a 670sq m inclusive playground on the site of the old creamery. The LEADER funded element of the project relates to the provision and installation of the playground equipment.

The overall cost of the project will be €134,974.10. Mayor Ahearn said - "The playground will meet the needs of over 600 children attending primary school and playschool in Ardfinnan and the surrounding villages of Goatenbridge and Grange."

Along with their parents and carers, the community council estimate that over 2,000 people will benefit directly from the facility.

The playground will also be a valuable facility for visitors to Ardfinnan such as users of the Suir Blueway, walkers, tourists and people coming to Ardfinnan for matches.

Cllr Ahearn added "At present there is no playground in Ardfinnan or the surrounding villages.

"The importance of playgrounds for children's physical and social development is well documented.

"Ardfinnan is a wonderful community and the playground makes the village even more attractive, and also offers a location for newcomers.

"I want to congratulate the community council and all the people who have worked so hard to make this possible".

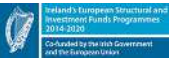

WASPS ARE WONDERFUL

I was leading a walk, and we were having a great chat, around nature. We were discussing the House-martins and swallows that were gathering, in large flocks, and they know it is nearly time, to head back to Africa.

The conversation was flowing nicely, when one lady asked a perennial question of "what use are wasps". Also with the schools reopening, teachers will soon be in touch, around how to deter wasps, from the school ground.

Over the last few weeks, wasps have been appearing, in bigger numbers. I have noticed them, out the front of my house, and they were been attracted, to the compost. This is full of fruit, and this is manna, from heaven for these insects. This is a part of the garden, where we spend a lot of time, so I moved the bins to the side of the house, and this simple solution, has diverted most of the wasps.

During the summer months, we are hardly aware of wasp. The workers are kept busy, foraging in our gardens and parks, for caterpillars, aphids and insects to bring back to their nest. These are then chewed up, and fed to the larva.

The larva keep the workers hooked, with a deli-

cious drop sugary drink. This arrangement runs smoothly, till the end of summer, and the larva, are ready to turn into adults. The workers are freed from their duties, and go looking for a substitute sweet drink.

They are attracted, by our holiday lifestyle and diet. At this time of the year bins overflow with ice-creams, fizzy drinks and treats. They also crawl into beer and wine bottles, and emerge slightly drunk. Unfortunately like in the human world, alcohol can increase aggression, and these wasps are more than likely to sting.

In the wild, the wasps drink the juices from blackberries. These also like the fermenting apples, and this makes them a little tipsy.

At summers end, the colony produces males and queens. These fly away to

mate, and the rest of the colony dies of, due to the cold and hunger. The new queens look for a dry and safe place, to hibernate for the winter, and will emerge in the spring, to begin a new colony.

Wasp's make the most amazing structures. On a walk during the summer, we found one in an oak tree. It was just after a very heavy shower, and the wasps, were still a bit docile. They were several wasps busy, patching a few tears in the nest, and keeping their home dry and waterproof, is a full time job.

They will fly to timber fences, and peel away layers of timber. This is chewed up and mixed with their spit, to make a strong paper. Wasps had perfected the art of paper making millions of years, before humans ever appeared.

Other insects use the warning colours of wasps, for their own protection. Hover flies have the black and yellow colours, and some even sound like bees, but they are nature's mimics. Birds will leave these insets alone, but spiders don't seem to be bothered, and I have often found hoverflies in their webs.

Succession in business - why you need to plan to succeed

FOR BUSINESS OWNERS, THE BIGGEST ASSET YOU HAVE IS YOUR BUSINESS. THAT'S WHY IT IS IMPORTANT TO PLAN FOR THE FUTURE.

A Succession strategy which is well planned and laid out can mitigate a range of problems and will ensure the smooth running of the business after an exit.

Even if you consider your exit to be years away, it is vital that you make a succession plan at an early stage.

1. INCOME AND PENSIONS

On a personal level, if something were to happen, what would happen to your pension and who would benefit? That comes under the area of nomination.

If you nominate a beneficiary, you are in a situation where that person does not have to go through a protracted legal process.

You can also nominate accounts to particular people to avoid delays in access. With Bank accounts, often the easiest way of doing this is by having a joint account.

2. ASSETS

If you have assets in joint names - Let's say a husband

and wife or a business partnership, you will normally put them in joint ownership

There are two types of joint ownership;

Joint Tenancy - Is the ownership over a house by a married couple.

Tenancy in Common - Is the ownership over certain property by individuals without any right of survivorship.

In marriage, if one person dies the asset will automatically go to the surviving partner under law. Even if a will is not made, the assets will automatically go the survivor.

Historically in Ireland, the family home would have been in the sole name of the husband. Then when they introduced the Family Home Protection Act, it meant that you could transfer the family home in to the names of both husband and wife.

Both hold the property in common and have an equal share in the property which they can then transfer by way of succession to someone else.

If you make a will, there is only one way that assets can be dealt with. That is why it is important to think about succession and act now as opposed to waiting until it could be too late.

3. WHAT IF THE PROPERTY HAS A MORTGAGE?

If the asset has a mortgage on it, you have to ensure that you get the consent of the lender which also worth bearing in mind.

Another thing to be careful of, if you are transferring assets then you must be solvent.

Let's say you transfer an asset to a child or family member and you do not get full value, under those circumstances, you must ensure that you are solvent as there is a legal mechanism whereby that transfer could be reversed if it is deemed to be wrong or unfair.

4. WHAT TAX IMPLICATIONS ARE THERE?

There are three taxes to be aware of:

*Capital Gains - This applies to the person disposing of an asset

*Capital Acquisition - Applies to the person receiving an asset

*Stamp Duty - Is applied on the transfer of property and certain assets.

5. CASE STUDY

Part of managing your business is managing your exit from the business.

The importance of this was made clear in a previous case I dealt with.

I was approached by 3 individuals who were setting up a business.

These individuals decided to go down the avenue of the limited liability company. One of the things I said to them was to make sure to finalise their shareholders agreement which would work out the rules and regulations of the company and would define their working relationships and roles within the company.

We discussed succession and outlined what would happen, sent them off with a draft but they were unable to make their follow up appointment.

Unfortunately one of the partners passed away suddenly before the agreement could be finalised with no succession rights in place.

This case highlights the need to have some agreement in place from the outset.

A Pre Nuptial Agreement would also come under the Succession umbrella.

While it may not be succession per se, it is succession control.

While the pre nup is still a relatively new concept here in Ireland, it is growing in popularity, especially in the farming community.

But it is something that should be viewed as a way to protect assets.

looking very glamorous indeed. There were plenty of umbrellas on the day to make sure that the dresses and suits remained dry and the excitement was evident on their faces.

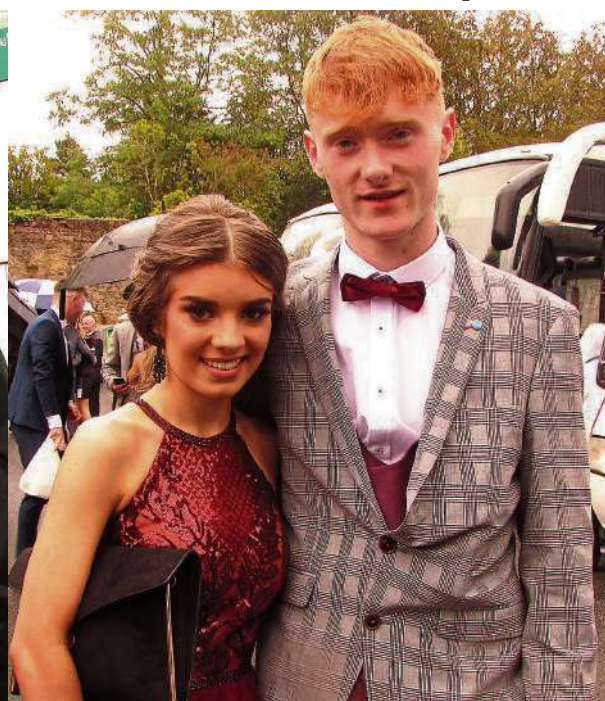

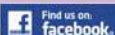

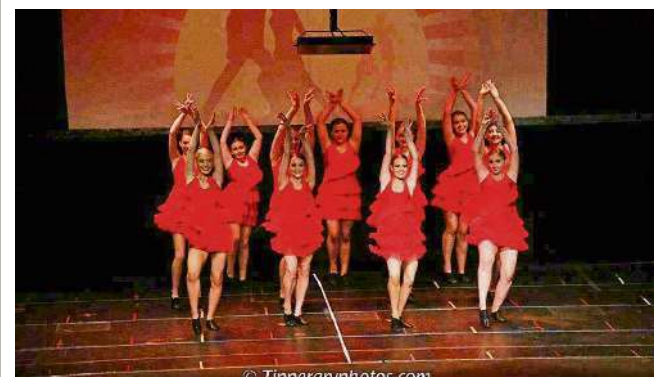

AN EXCEL YOUTH THEATRE PRODUCTION

Excel Youth Theatre's superb production of West Side Story a musical treat

The great strength and beauty of West Side Story comes from its source, William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet. This classic love story has been told in so many varied ways, but none more effectively than through the medium of musical theatre, and the combined genius of Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim and Arthur Laurents.

What they created was, in its day, a modern masterpiece, with one of the most entrancing musical scores ever written... and so it remains, ever popular, and ever relevant.

Director Michael O'Donoghue assisted by Mary Condon O'Connor gave us a production with plenty of novel twists that gave the show a fresh treatment in the Excel Youth Theatre's run at the Excel in Tipperary town.

Joanne Ryan's set was well painted, and clean and efficient in design, Caoimne Carey's projections worked really well and stage manager Jo Smith and her stage crew controlled the placing and removal of a wide range of very good props, with efficiency, hence preventing scene changes from disrupting the pace of the show.

Good choice of colours helped the lighting design to enhance the set, and generally, lighting added to the tone and atmosphere of the production. Great work on props here from Catherine Sharpe and Trish O'Brien, on lighting from Michael O'Donoghue and Stephen Reck and on sound from Pat Marnane and Aimee Fogarty.

Keating, was always interesting, often dynamic, and occasionally very precise. The dance at the gym had moments of magic, and there was some nice acrobatic work. America was a good showcase for the girls, and Officer Krupke was great fun for the lads, brilliantly led by Action.

Musical Director Peter Taylor would have liked a few more musicians for the complexity of West Side Story, but the musicians he had made a good job of filling out the score. The ever changing rhythms and time signatures were very well realised.

The "Tonight Ensemble" is one of the few opportunities for good choral work, and along with "Somewhere", highlighted some very fine vocals. The Jets were also extremely impressive during the Jet song.

Aaron Holland as Tony, displayed a fine, tenor voice, well able to hit the high notes. Phillipa Harold Barry as Maria, grew in every department as the show progressed. Her confidence grew when she sang "Tonight", and by the time she sang "I Feel Pretty" she had settled into character.

Tadhg O'Connor exuded confidence as Riff. He was extremely enthusiastic in his dancing and had confidence in his acting too. He was vocally sound in the delivery of his songs.

Shane Donovan gave a quiet confidence to the role of Bernardo, and was a plausible leader of his gang. He had very good stage presence, and danced well at the gym.

Nicole Butler was a very convincing Anita, with a per-

fect look and a good sense of comedy. Her taunting scene with the Jets was well acted, and vocally, she was wonderful during "America".

She also put passionate emotion into "A Boy Like That", and hers was a very enjoyable performance.

Adam Skeffington as Action, gave one of the most confident performances of the night, involving himself constantly and believably in the action, even when not the focus of attention. His fiery attitude was always apparent, and it built to a show-stopping rendition of "Officer Krupke" which literally brought the house down.

Likewise, Eimear Hughes as Anybodys, maintained her character strongly throughout the show, enjoying the tough Tom-boy at-

titude, and enhancing her performance with a good accent and excellent dancing.

Sadhbh Donovan as Velma, and the current Pride of Tipperary, Muireann Slatery as Graziella made their presence felt in the opportunities they had, being particularly noteworthy in the dance numbers.

Likewise, Nicole Kennedy as Consuela and choreographer Kirsty Keating as Rosalia made a good impact with their dialogue and vocally in "America" and "I Feel Pretty", where they were ably supported by Shauna Frewen as Francisca.

Cormac Maher (A-rab), Andrew Richardson (Big Deal), Zach O'Halloran (Diesel) and Ben Esmonde as Baby John, gave great support as the Jets, and their dancing was buzzing with raw energy and effort.

Luke Condon as Chino, made a good job of reporting the "Rumble" to Maria, and he played the shooting scene very well. He had good backup from Steven Donohoe as Pepe, Sam Ryan as Indio, Jack O'Connor as Juano and Robert Bradshaw as Jose.

David Hughes played upon store owner Doc, and his delicate scene with Tony was nicely handled. Similarly, an eccentric and quirky performance was given by Darragh McGrath as Glad Hand.

Eoghan Ryan had a good stage presence as Lt. Schrank, while Tom Hogan as Officer Krupke was suitably angry and abrupt.

Ella Flynn had a lovely voice as the "Somewhere" soloist, but will no doubt be a young performer to keep an

eye on in the future.

The chorus for this production gave one hundred per cent commitment to maintaining a high energy performance, with great physical presence and enthusiastic vocals.

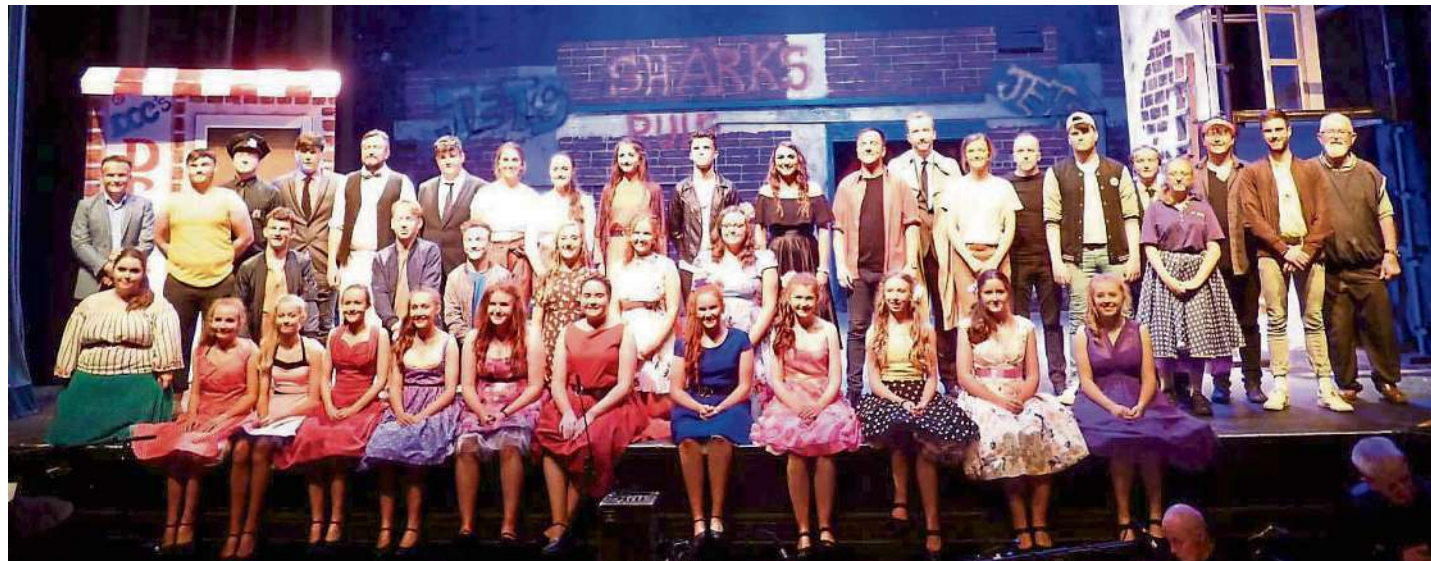
The wardrobe plot for the show was very appropriate and tidy. There was good attention to torn t-shirts after the fight and good injury make-up and the girls, both in costume and hair-styles looked perfectly turned out. Great work here from Brigid Whelan, Marie Fogarty, Kate Fogarty and team.

The Excel Theatre was suitable decked out with plenty of photographs of the cast adorning the walls of the entrance to the auditorium, courtesy of Elaine Fitzpatrick and the show programme by award-winning programme editor Ruth Butler was informative and a great souvenir of the show for both the audience and cast.

The Excel Youth Theatre's wonderful production of Children of Eden last year was certainly a difficult act to follow, but this young enthusiastic group certainly rose to the challenge with this production of West Side Story which most certainly showcased the young talent that lies in Tipperary Town and the surrounding area. The sheer aplomb with which this production was carried off is testament to the hard work put in by the cast, the wonderful production team and the bevy of background helpers who make up the Excel Youth Theatre Group. 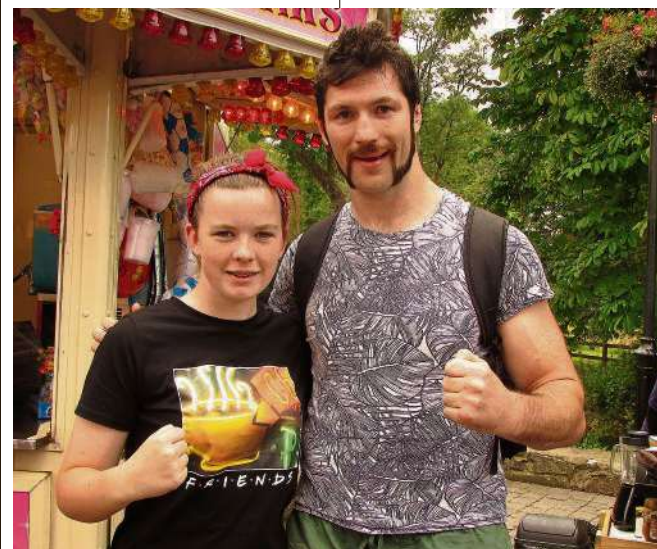
